


Opening Student Assembly

Student Clubs & After School Activities

Yangon Academy after school activities officially began on Monday, August 26th. This year we have over 23 clubs and other after school activities for secondary students to choose from. These activities will run every day, either during lunch or after school from 3:30 - 4:30 pm.



An assembly was held on August 23rd to not only honor our newly elected student council representatives, but also our last year's AP Scholars. Twenty four Yangon Academy students earned an annual distinction identified by the College Board.

AP Scholar: 10 students

Granted to students who earned an AP score of 3 or higher on three or more AP exams.

AP Scholar with Honor: 10 students

Granted to students who receive an average score of at least 3.25 on all AP exams taken, and scores of 3 or higher on four or more of these AP exams.

AP Scholar with Distinction: 4 students

Granted to students who receive an average score of at least 3.5 on all AP exams taken, and scores o 3 or higher on five or more of these exams.

Teaching and Learning center

This is the first year that Yangon Academy is implementing the Teaching and Learning Center (TLC). This is an opportunity for students to receive extra help with their studies from a subject area teacher.
